P My dear friends, we gather in this holy season of Lent to look at our relationship to God and to one another. Are we doing all we can to fulfill the promises of our baptism? Realizing we are not perfect, we have come here together to ask for God's mercy.

HOMILY

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

MARK 14:3-9

Jesus said, “Let her alone. Why do you make trouble for her? She has done a good thing for me.”

Reader I: Deep in our hearts, we all desire a closer relationship with God. Without love, that desire can be distorted as envy and jealousy.

Reader II: Am I excessively critical of other people’s faults, even though I make excuses for my own weaknesses? Do I thank God for the blessings enjoyed by family members and friends?

A **Have I helped other people prepare for death, or do I withdraw from those who are suffering? Do I consider and prepare for my own death?**

(pause for reflection)

P A clean heart create for me, O God,

A **and a steadfast spirit renew within me.**

MARK 14:17-21

As they reclined at table and were eating, Jesus said, “Amen, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me.”

Reader I: Betrayal is a terrible violation of trust, no matter what the circumstances might be.

Reader II: Have I been faithful to the promises I have made? Have I fulfilled my responsibilities at home and in the workplace or at school?

A **Do I participate regularly and faithfully in the Eucharist? Do I respect the name of Jesus?**
