## *Introduction*

We have so many tasks on our “to-do list,” especially during the Advent and Christmas seasons. There is so much to do that often the things that really matter get lost in the shuffle. That is where these devotions come in. Each week focuses on a task that should be on our lists in addition to the tasks that are already traditionally on them. In Week 1, we think about how we can both buy presents and be present for one another. We ponder how to send peace as we send Christmas cards in Week 2. ## THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

*Be Present**Look, the Lamb of God!*

JOHN 1:36

Advent has arrived, and we're preparing for the arrival of Christ. We rejoice that Immanuel, God with us, is with us. And with Christ's promises always within reach we give thanks for opportunities to reach out to others with the love of the Promised One.

As Christ comes to be present in his world, among his people, and in his Church we discover the core of Advent and Christmas.

John pointed his disciples to Jesus as he passed by. He said, "Look, the Lamb of God!" (John 1:36).

Advent provides time for us to be present with Christ.

Two disciples heard John announcing Jesus as the Lamb of God, and they followed him. They asked Jesus where he was staying. Jesus invited them to come with him to find out (John 1:37-39).

Advent calls us to be present with others through Christ.

Andrew was one of the two who followed Jesus, and the first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him they had found the Messiah, Christ. Then Andrew brought his brother to Jesus (John 1:40-42).

Advent and Christmas aren't just about presents, but more about presence.

## *Wait, Don't Wait*

*Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.*

HEBREWS 9:28

In some way, waiting has been a way of life for God's people. First, they waited for the presence of the promised Savior in the world. And now, living beyond the manger and cross, we wait for Christ's return.

Not knowing when he will return, we feel an urgency to tell and live out God's story, so ...

- Don't wait to encourage your pastor and family in person or to pray for them while waiting at a stoplight.
- Don't wait to ask your waiter or waitress for prayer requests.
- Don't wait to offer a kind word to a stranger waiting in line.
- Don't wait to thank Jesus for removing the weight of your sin.
- Don't wait, wasting time, while you could be reading and studying Scripture.
- Don't wait to be present for someone weighted down by loneliness.
- And don't wait to pray Scripture, like ... (wait for it...)

*I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope  
(Psalm 130:5). Amen.*

## *The Lord Is Present*

*[Jacob said:] Surely the Lord is in this place and I  
did not know it.*

GENESIS 28:16

How many times could we have said that, along with Jacob? We've become oblivious to the obvious. How often we attribute the Lord being present and working in our lives to luck, coincidence or our own doing?

Advent calls us to slow down and take time to recognize God's presence as we look for and look forward to his presence in Bethlehem, in his Word and Sacraments, and in his return. We pray the Spirit keeps us aware and our Savior forgives us when we fail. Surely the Lord is in this place.

Surely the Lord is ...

- in boardrooms, living rooms, hospital rooms;
- on the battlefield, flowering fields, and things that come out of left field;
- where we work out, eat out, and hang out; and
- in bread and wine, water and the Word, and Genesis through Revelation.

We pray we will realize his presence, give him thanks and glory, and allow others to see Christ in us and give him praise.
