

The Plan to Live

Monday of the First Week

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat..." Genesis 2:15-17

We might think that Adam and Eve sat around in the Garden of Eden all day. The Bible tells us they had jobs. They took care of the earth and themselves. They had lots of good work to do.

God also gave them one rule. He told them they could eat fruit from any tree except one. If they ate from the one tree, they would die. That is a harsh consequence, but that was the rule.

God gave Adam and Eve a plan to live—follow the one rule and take care of Creation. God promised also to be there and help them do everything necessary to live.

What Did God Say?

Tuesday of the First Week

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden?'" Genesis 3:1

Has a parent or teacher ever told you to do something, and then you forgot? Or maybe she told you NOT to do something, and you did something different. Then you know what happened in Eden.

Remember the one rule God gave Adam and Eve? Don't eat from that one tree. It's important! That's a pretty simple rule, but the devil used a snake to talk to Eve. The snake said, "Did God really say that?" She thought she knew the answer, but the little question got her thinking.

When we disobey our parents by trying to twist the words, we know what happened to Eve that day.

Help me change. Amen.*

Wednesday of the First Week

Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." Genesis 3:13

"It's not my fault!" A lot of times, that's the first thing we say when we get accused of doing something wrong. We look to blame someone else.

Eve said the snake tricked her. Notice she went on to say, "And I ate it."

We might feel like it's not all our fault, but we should confess when we sin. We should admit what we did was wrong (even when we feel like blaming someone else.) That sin gets in the way of our love for others, including God. When we confess our sin, we can be forgiven and work on loving others better.
