Here is a fun and family-friendly way to journey through the Bible. Five trivia questions on various topics related to the Bible appear on each card. Families can play detective and discover about what answers might be and check to see if their answers are right as a kind of quick devotion on the go. Tear off one page

for each of 25 days. Read the questions on the front and turn the card over to uncover the answers. Quiz one another about the "Animals and Plants" mentioned in the Bible. Find out about the "Books and Verses" that make up the Bible. Discover the "Names and People" that are found on the pages of God's Word. Learn about the familiar "Places and Numbers" we run across in this holy book. Answer challenging "True and False" questions about the Old and New Testament events. Animals & Plants: Who gave names to the animals that God had created?

Card 1

Books & Verses: What Bible book comes before the book of Revelation?

Names & People: What was the name of the first man?

Places & Numbers: In what town was Jesus born?

True or False: God created the universe by his Word.

- **AGP:** Adam gave names to the animals that God created (Genesis 2:19-20).
- **BGV:** The book of Jude comes before the book of Revelation in the Bible.
- **NGP:** The first man was named Adam, which means "earth" or "soil," because God created him from the dust of the ground and breathed life into him (Genesis 2:7).
- **PGN:** Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Israel (Luke 2:4-7).
- **ToF:** True. Hebrews 11:3 says, "By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God."

Card 2

Animals 6 Plants: What kind of bird flew back to Noah with a fresh olive leaf?

Books & Verses: What is the shortest verse in the Bible?

Names & People: What is the name of Jesus' mother?

Places & Numbers: Where did Joseph take Mary and baby Jesus to escape from King Herod?

True or False: The gospel of Mark tells us about Jesus' birth.

- **AGP:** After the ark had come to rest on the mountains, a dove was sent out from the ark by Noah. The dove came back with a freshly picked olive leaf, showing that the waters had gone down and life was growing on the earth again (Genesis 8:11).
- **B&V:** The shortest verse in the Bible is John 11:35, "Jesus wept." Jesus cried at the tomb of his friend Lazarus, and then raised Lazarus from the dead.
- NGP: Jesus' mother is Mary (Luke 1:26-31).
- **P6N:** An angel told Joseph to take Mary and baby Jesus to Egypt to escape from King Herod, who wanted to destroy the new King (Matthew 2:13).
- **ToF:** False. The gospel of Mark begins, not with the story of Jesus' birth but with the work of John the Baptist (Mark 1:1-4).

Animals & Plants: Of the six days of creation, on which day did God make birds and fish?

Card 3

Books & Verses: Which book of the Bible does not mention God?

Names & People: Which king of Israel was famous for his wisdom and his wealth?

Places & Numbers: How many disciples did Jesus have?

True or False: Ruth from Moab was one of Jesus' ancestors.

- **AGP:** God created birds and fish on the fifth day of creation (Genesis 1:20-23).
- **B&V:** The book of Esther does not speak of God, even though the book tells the story of Esther, a Jewish queen who saved the people of God during the reign of King Ahasuerus of Persia.
- **NGP:** King Solomon was famous for his wisdom and his wealth. God told the young king to ask for anything he wanted. Instead of asking for wealth, Solomon asked for wisdom to be a good king. God granted him both wisdom and wealth (1 Kings 3:10-13; 1 Kings 4:29; 1 Kings 10:21).
- **PGN:** Jesus had many followers, but he chose twelve men to be his closest disciples. He called them apostles, which means people who are sent, because he would send them out to teach about the kingdom of God (Luke 6:12-16).
- **ToF:** True. The story of Ruth is told in the book named for her. Ruth, who was from the country of Moab, married an Israelite named Boaz. She became the great-grandmother of King David. She is listed in Jesus' family tree (Matthew 1:5-6).
