Here is a fun and family-friendly way to learn more about Mass and the Sacraments. Five questions related to these gifts appear on each card. Families can wonder about what answers

might be and then check to see if they are correct. As a daily devotion, tear off a page each day. Read the questions on the front and turn the card over to uncover the answers. Quiz each other on what Mass and the Sacraments mean for our lives. Find out why God gives them to us. Discover how and when to receive them. Answer “True and False” questions about Mass and the Sacraments.

What do I WONDER about the MASS & SACRAMENTS?

What: What does God say about attending Mass?

Why: Why do we attend Mass?

How: How shall we prepare to attend Mass?

When: When are we to attend Mass?

True or False: When we go to Mass, we don't just anticipate heaven, we get to share in it.

What: God says in the Third Commandment to honor the Sabbath Day (Exodus 20:8). We do that through worshiping him.

Why: We celebrate Mass because that's where we see and hear Jesus who speaks to us in his Word and is present for us in the Eucharist.

How: During the week we pray, read our Bible and say the Rosary.

When: Every Sunday and every Holy Day of Obligation, such as Epiphany, Ascension and All Saints Day.

ToF: True. In the Mass, heaven comes down to us.

What do I WONDER about the MASS & SACRAMENTS?

What: What gesture accompanies the words “In the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit”?

Why: Why do we make the sign of the cross?

How: How do I make the sign of the cross?

When: When did Jesus state the importance of the cross?

True or False: Jesus says to take up our cross and follow him.

What: Making the sign of the cross.

Why: We make the sign of the cross when we enter the Church and at various times during the Mass, especially when we hear the priest say, “In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.”

How: Holding your right thumb to your pointy finger and your middle finger, you raise your hand to your forehead and say, “In the name of the Father.” Lower your hand to your waist and say, “and of the Son.” Move your hand to your left shoulder and say, “and of the Holy.” Then you bring your hand to your right shoulder and say, “Spirit. Amen”

When: Jesus died on a cross to forgive the sin of the world.

ToF: True. (Matthew 16:24)

What do I WONDER about the MASS & SACRAMENTS?

What: What is holy water?

Why: Why do we dip our hand into the water located in entrance?

How: How do we apply holy water?

When: When did Jesus speak about this holy water?

True or False: We are baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Church.

Who: Holy water is water that has been blessed by a member of the clergy or a religious figure.

What: We apply holy water to remind us of our baptism. Catholic Christians dip their fingers in the holy water and make the sign of the cross when entering the church. This use of holy water and making a sign of the cross when entering a church reflects a renewal of baptism, a cleansing of venial sin, as well as providing protection against evil.

How: You dip your right hand into the water then make the sign of the cross.

Grace: Jesus promises us that baptism saves us. (Mark 16:15)

ToF: False. We are baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Matthew 28:19)
