Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

PROVERBS 3:5-6

So much of life involves trusting in the Lord. Notice the Bible doesn't say to trust just a little or once in a while. It says to trust in the Lord *with all your heart.* What does that mean? Consider Mary, the mother of Jesus, who said to the angel Gabriel, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). She did not fully understand how the Christ Child would come to be born through her, but she trusted wholeheartedly, without reservation and without a second thought. The love Mary had for Jesus lasted throughout his life, even as she stood at the foot of his cross on Good Friday. She trusted in God's plan for him and for her all the way until the end. Trust does not rely on intellect or great insight. It simply guides the soul and points to the path that God wants you to go as a woman of faith.
