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Thoughts on Sunday's Readings

The Jewish people have always had many laws and traditions which give stability and direction to their lives. They know God gave them these laws as guides for their benefit because he loved them. In the **First Reading** from Deuteronomy, Moses told Israel to listen to and learn the laws which have come from the Lord.

Observing these laws will allow them to enter the Promised Land someday. Notice that the people are told not to add to OR subtract from any of God's commandments. Only God as the Giver of the Law has the authority to make any changes in it.

Thousands of years later, Jesus and his disciples were still faithfully observing these traditions. But Jesus knows that following tradition for its own sake, without any connection to the meaning of that tradition, is starting to get off track. Tradition is there to guide us into that deeper meaning as soon as we're ready to accept it.

In Sunday's **Gospel**, Jesus is trying to help people grow in their understanding of what they do and why they do these things.

- Discuss similarities and differences in the meaning of teaching and learning.

Another element to the meaning of these words is added through the word *understanding*. As a teacher you know well how hard it is to get your students to UNDERSTAND what you teach them. Jesus often faced the same obstacles as he delivered his message.

Help students learn what the word *defile* means. Use the words from the **Second Reading** to help you: "Religion that is pure and UNDEFILED before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world" (James 1:27).

A Motto to Live By

- Call attention to another passage from Sunday's Second Reading from James: "Be doers of the word and not hearers only..."
- What does this mean for us?

Point out how in the lives of all the saints we have models that show us how to accomplish this.

Feasts and Saints

Tuesday, August 27

St. Monica

322-387

St. Monica's faith and love were manifested in a life devoted to prayer, especially for her husband and her son, the great St. Augustine. Monica loved both of them very much, but realized that until each of them was ready to change his life and be baptized a Christian, she could not do much but continue to pray.

Eventually her prayers were answered, and both men were baptized. She is truly a model of how to be a loving and patient spouse and parent.

Wednesday, August 27

St. Augustine of Hippo

354-430

Augustine is considered one of the great saints of the Church, even though his early life was far from saintly. Although he was a brilliant man, he cheated in school!

After his conversion to Christianity at the age of 28, he was called back to Africa, his birthplace, and named bishop of Hippo. Augustine is considered one of the "Four Great Latin Fathers of the Church." His writings, especially *Confessions*, earned him the title Doctor of the Church, a title similar to a Ph.D.

Discuss the relationship between St. Augustine and his mother, St. Monica. Though her son seemed hopelessly lost in sin, Monica never gave up on him. She prayed constantly for his conversion. Remind students that their own parents (teachers too!) want the best for them and will continue loving and praying for their children no matter what. When parents "nag," it is for the same reason. (Recall last week's Second Reading about discipline: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13.)

Sunday, August 29

The Passion of St. John the Baptist

Before you read/discuss this week's Gospel passage, talk about the ancient Jewish tradition of washing hands.

- We also wash our hands mostly to promote cleanliness and to prevent the spread of sickness and disease.
- For the Jewish people, washing hands accomplished the same thing, except it went beyond physical cleanliness and became a regular religious ritual practiced by all faithful Jews. This is the reason the Pharisees questioned the behavior of Jesus and his disciples.
- Have the children noticed the priest washing his hands during the Eucharist? This practice dates back to this same ritual washing tradition of the Jews.
- Make a list of things we do regularly, sometimes without thinking much about it. So why do we do these things?
- Discuss some different customs. Maybe your parish has a yearly custom or event such as a parish day, picnic, special dinner or maybe a liturgical service you do every year.
- Another word for these things is tradition.

Family Activity

- Have a family discussion about traditions that are special. Invite each family member to talk about his/her favorite thing the family does together and why it is so special.
- OR**
- If this activity is not practical for many of your students, encourage children to think about their own favorite tradition.
- OR**
- Have a discussion about church or school traditions.

Tuesday

While students are working on the Journal exercise, invite them to share their favorite traditions with the class.

- What do they remember best, or even more important, WHY do they remember these things?
- The traditions that are the most special are filled with memories. While we constantly seek to make new memories, we must also draw on the past. This is true for both family and Church traditions.

Thursday

- Encourage the recitation of the first part of the Confiteor. Point out that this Latin word means "I Confess." (Complete text can be found on the inside front/back cover of the planners.)

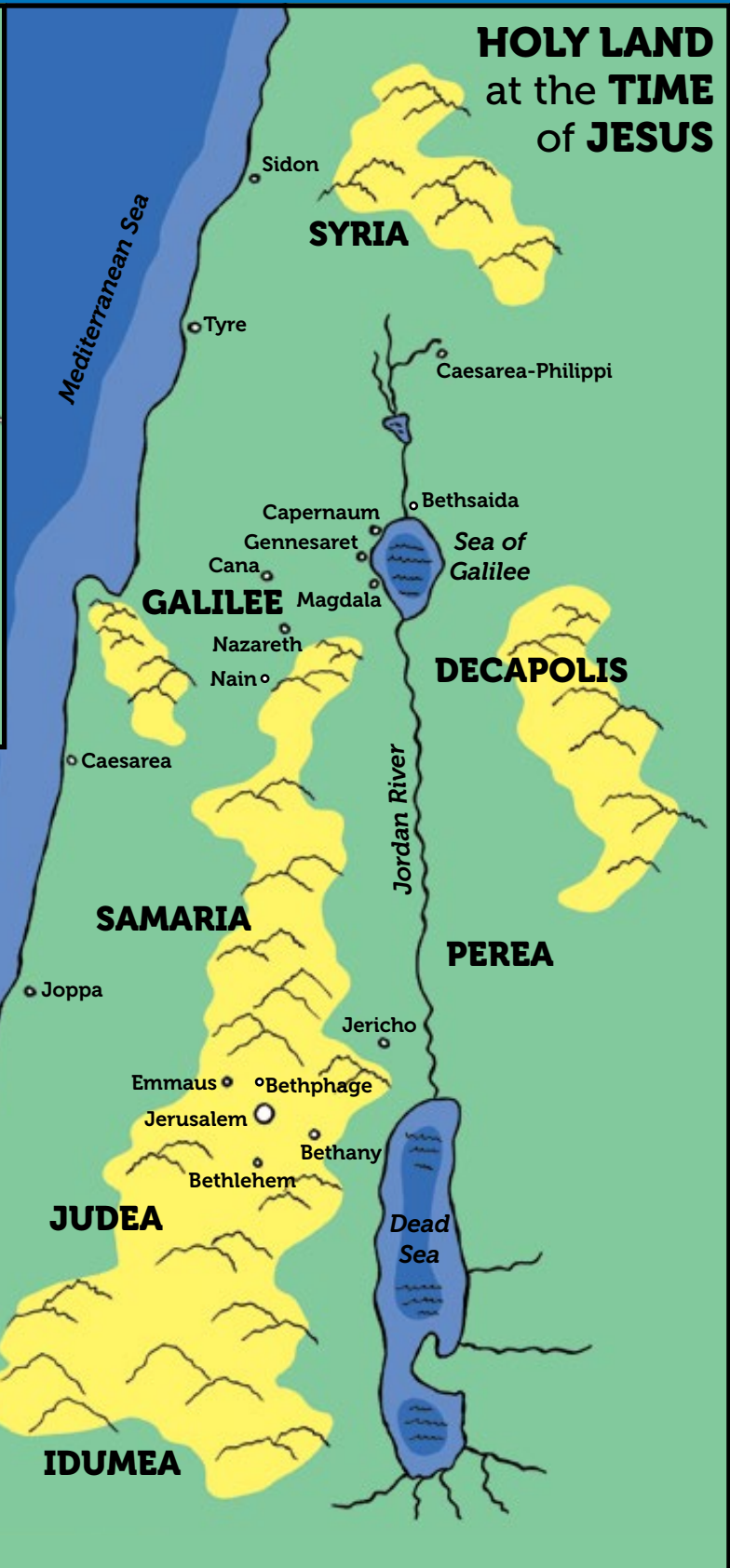
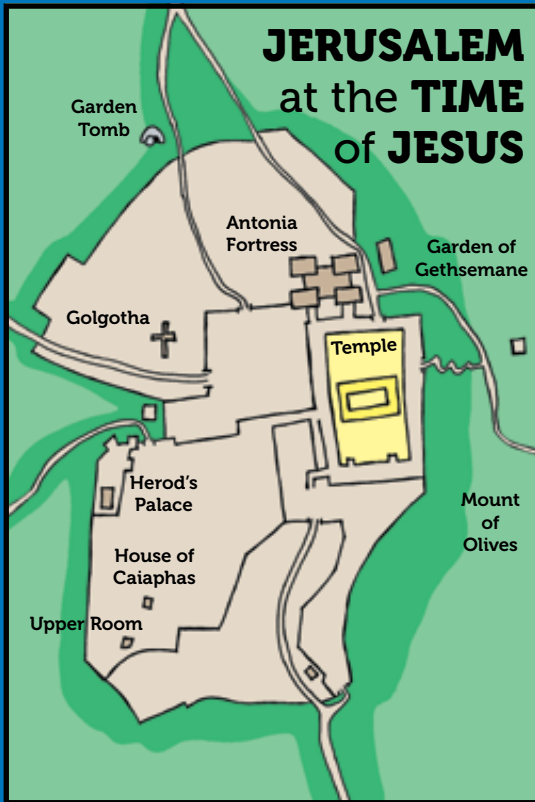
Friday

Sunday's Second Reading from the Letter to James says, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only..." (This passage can be found on page 31 of the planners.)

- Becoming "doers of the word" means we show others how much Jesus loves them, and the best way to help others understand is by loving them ourselves. How did Jesus show others he loved them?
- How can we do the same? (Examples are contained in the second half of the Reading [James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27].) Read it to the class.
- Ask students for their ideas about how to show others that Jesus loves them.
- Encourage following through with this week's Disciples... exercise.
- Close with the Lord's Prayer or another prayer chosen by the class, or some spontaneous prayers.
