Dealing With Dust

For he knows how we were made; he remembers that we are dust. • PSALM 103:14

For Sinners

...he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

♦ ISAIAH 53:12 (ESV)

Obedient to his heavenly Father, the Son of God humbled himself to be born among us. Tempted as we are, Jesus did not sin, yet he was numbered with sinners, that is, counted among them. At the beginning of his public ministry, the Savior, who did not sin, stood with sinners to receive a baptism of repentance in the Jordan River. He ate with people whom society called "sinners."

When the hour of his death came, Jesus was again "numbered with the transgressors" as he was crucified between two criminals. The sinless Son of God died in the place of sinners so that our sins are forgiven. Baptized, we are now numbered with the saints, and God is at work in us each day, conforming us to the image of his Son.

God's Grace Is Sufficient

My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness. • 2 CORINTHIANS 12:9
